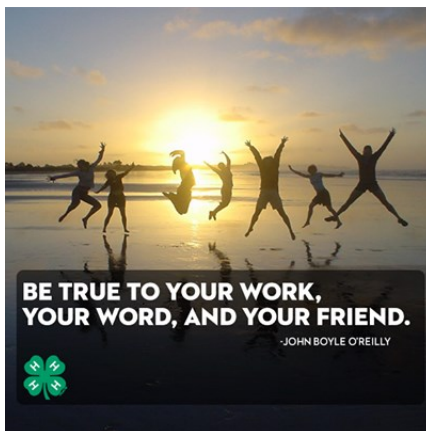
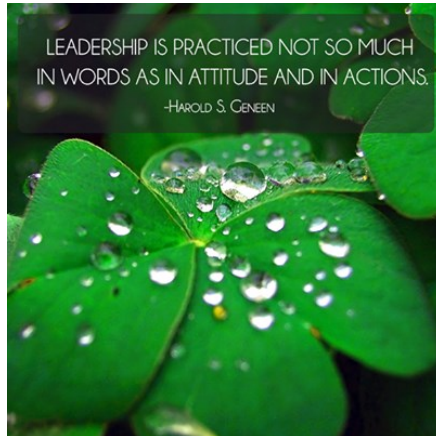


Winnie 4-H Club

Easter Craft

Supplies:

Paper plate
Cotton balls
Glue
Scissors
Black construction paper
Googly eyes
Black marker



1. Trace a sheep's head, four rectangles and a small circle on to the black construction paper with your marker.
2. Use scissors to cut out the shapes .
3. Decorate the sheep's face with a nose and mouth and googly eyes.
4. Glue cotton balls onto the paper plate.
5. Glue sheep head, legs and tail onto the sheep.
