## Did you know?

#### 4-H Trivia

The 4-H logo was originally a 3 leaf clover, adopted in 1907. In 1908, the logo was changed to the beloved 4 leaf clover with an "H" on each leaf that is still the national symbol for 4-H today.



#### SCIENCE **S** DO IT YOURSELF SCIENCE Blast off! You'll need: A long piece of string or fishing line Make a balloon-powered rocket · Onest Ever wondered how aeroplanes, rockets and birds propel themselves into the sky? They each use the principle of thrust to help lift their mass from Earth's gravitational pull. This simple experiment shows how thrust can be used even on a small scale to create forward motion. Thread your string or fishin Step 3 Blow but don't tie it Step 2 Tie each end of the string to two fixed points. It could be two trees o solid chairs or two post: Step 4 Tape the balloon to the straw carefully, Balloon power Try experimenting with different without letting any air escape Make sure the shaped balloons balloon's mouth Step 5 Once your balloon is anchored to the straw, let the balloon go and watch your rocket fly along the trajectory Rocket facts: tted for it What's happening? As the air rushes out of your balloon it creates a forward motion known as thrust, which require both direction and energy. In this experiment, energy is achieved by the release of air from the balloon, while the direction is determined by the string and the location of the balloon's mouth piece Birds in flight achieve thrust by flapping their wings and creating energy in small constant bursts. In rockets, burning fuel blasted from the engine creates enough force to push the spacecraft into the air in the opposite direction.

## Frozen peanut butter Banana bites

Ingredients:
Bananas
Peanut butter

Dark chocolate chips

- 1. Slice bananas
- 2. Spoon peanut butter onto half of the banana slices. Place other bananas on top of peanut butter.
- 3. Freeze for 30 minutes.
- 4. Melt chocolate chips.
- 5. Cover peanut butter bananas with the melted chocolate.
- 6. Freeze for 3 hours or until chilled.
